POLICY

The College shall extend reasonable and appropriate accommodations, to the extent required by statute, to those students who demonstrate evidence of an ongoing qualifying disability. Such accommodations may not materially interfere with a student's ability to acquire the competencies necessary for successful completion of the program nor provide relief from the requirement of meeting the minimum technical standards as published in the College Catalog.

RESPONSIBLE OFFICIAL(S):

Office of Student Affairs

PROCEDURES

1. Students who would like to request an accommodation for a qualifying disability are responsible for filing the request with the Office of Student Affairs utilizing documentation guidelines as outlined in the Student Handbook.
2. A diagnosis of a disability does not necessarily qualify a student for academic accommodations under the law. Documentation must indicate that the disability substantially limits some major life activity and/or learning.
3. If the Dean or designee ascertains that the accommodation would cause an undue hardship for the College, the assertion must be made on reasonable grounds and documented in writing.
