Daniel Kerlinsky is an Assistant Clinical Professor teaching Osteopathic Child Psychiatry to third-year medical students at the Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine. Dr. Kerlinsky earned his A.B. at Harvard College with honors in Experimental Psychology. He began his study of Psycho-Neuro-Endocrinology while getting his M.D. at Tufts. After internship at Charity Hospital New Orleans he completed Psychiatric residency at The New York Hospital, Westchester division before resuming service to the under-served in New Mexico with a Child Psychiatry fellowship and 15 years at the University of New Mexico Children's Psychiatry Hospital. His passion for science and activism led to a position on The Secretary of Energy Advisory Board Task Force on Alternative Futures for the National Labs. He has been in private practice in Albuquerque since 1999 where his focus on the adrenal glands and white matter structures in the brain have been driven by the insights and teachings of Andrew Taylor Still, William Garner Sutherland, and Jean-Pierre Barrall - all world-renowned Osteopaths and pioneers.
